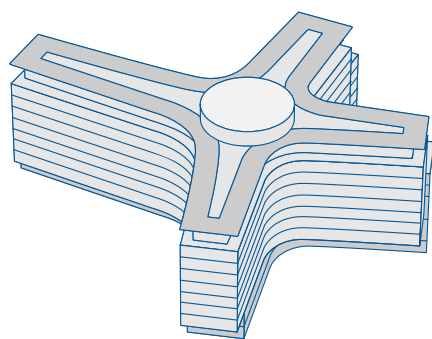

Parties choose their candidates for the European elections

Expected Winter 2023/24

European party families elect their lead candidates/Spitzenkandidierende

Expected end March 2024

Deadline for submitting lists of German candidates to the
Federal Election Commissioner

Expected May 2024

European elections

May/June 2024

On the basis of the election result, the European Council
proposes the President of the Commission

June/July 2024

The European Parliament elects
the President of the EU Commission

✓ Important to EM Germany

- Take the 49 proposals of the Conference on the Future of Europe as the basis for the parties' election manifestos for the 2024 European elections
- European party families should put forward lead candidates/ Spitzenkandidierende for the presidency of the EU Commission
- Introduce a coherent EU electoral law with transnational lists and a uniform voting age as of 16 years
